For all the relative calm since Sept. 11, counterterrorism experts and government officials have told TIME that America's luck will probably run out again and that another terrorist attack is certain. Experts warn about mass contamination of the nation's food supply and nuclear attacks on major U.S. cities. Since Sept. 11, the CIA and FBI have been in a desperate scramble to bolster security, but, as a TIME investigation reveals, the U.S. is still as vulnerable as it was before the horrific attacks.

ANSETT: ONE DOWN, TWO ALOFT

Ansett is all but dead after administrators last week failed to complete a sale of the Tesna consortium headed by Solomon Lew and Lindsay Fox.
